



Bulletin Board Display

Bulletin Board Display, individual or team event that creates an example of a classroom bulletin board of any age/grade level showcasing classroom activities and student work- following the theme of their interpretation of the FCCLA State Conference.

ELIGIBILITY

1. Participation is open to any Nevada state affiliated, FCCLA chapter member.
2. The Bulletin Board must be developed and completed within a one-year span beginning the day following the previous state conference and ending the day of competition.
3. The theme for the Nevada FCCLA State Conference follows the National FCCLA theme for the year. This theme is “incREDible FCCLA” and can be found on the Nevada and National FCCLA Website.
4. The Bulletin Board Display must be planned and prepared by the participants’ only.

PROCEDURES & TIME REQUIREMENTS

1. Each participant shall have five (5) minutes to set up their display prior to their competition time.
2. Evaluators will have five (5) minutes to review the display.
3. Participants will have up to ten (10) minutes to answer judges’ questions through an interview regarding the planning and arrangement of their display
4. The total time requirement for this event is 20 minutes.
5. The Bulletin Board Display project must be planned and prepared by the participants only.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Participants may use an area between 4’ L x 3’ H and 6’ L x 4’ H (may use any material- paper, poster board, foam board, fabric, cord board, etc.). Participants can use printed, computer designed, die cut, or other aided design materials as long as they are created by the participants.
2. No electrical current will be provided.
3. Participant must bring all materials including décor, a stand, etc. The participant(s), not the State Association, is responsible for the safe keeping of all materials used.
4. Wall space may not be available for propping items.
5. Participants must be dressed appropriately and professionally

Specifications

<i>Use of Theme</i>	Theme should be easy for the viewer to interpret
<i>Originality</i>	Present a unique interpretation of the state conference theme without duplicating conference graphics
<i>Chapter Name/Year Identified</i>	Chapter name AND conference year(s) must be present on the display (Ex: Nevada High School 2021 or 2021-2022)
<i>Visibility</i>	The overall design should be easily viewed from a distance
<i>Spelling, Punctuation, and Grammar</i>	Bulletin Board must look professional with proper spelling, punctuation, and grammar
<i>Elements of Design</i>	Incorporate the elements of design: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Color• Line• Shape• Texture• Space
<i>Teaching Strategies</i>	Demonstrate knowledge of Effective Teaching Strategies: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Make student work main focus• Keep it simple• Create interactive displays• Demonstrate that students have choice in work displayed on bulletin board
<i>Overall Appearance</i>	All elements and principals of design should create an appealing Bulletin Board
